
HIGH & THIRD STREET CONSTRUCTION

PROPERLY DISPOSE OF CFLs



Compact Fluorescent lightbulbs (CFLs) contain mercury, which is a hazardous substance. When the glass in these bulbs is broken the mercury is released into the atmosphere. This mercury contaminates whatever it comes in contact with like equipment, or any person who handles them. DO NOT break the bulbs or place them in the trash or recycling bin. The only safe way to

dispose of a CFL or any other fluorescent bulb is to take them to a retail store that sells that type of bulb. The store will be able to recycle the bulbs!
